General information

Standard Family Contribution (SFC)

The SFC assists the Foundation to support the ongoing development of the School. The SFC is payable in instalments when the eldest child enters the School, moves from ELC to Junior School and/or moves from Junior School to Senior School. The total amount payable for all instalments is to a maximum of \$3,695.

Out-of-School Care

Out-of-School Care fees are invoiced fortnightly in arrears. Eligible families can apply for government Child Care Subsidy.

Junior and Senior Schools

In 2021, Preparatory – Year 12 tuition fees are billed in four equal instalments. Please note: from 2022, Year 12 tuition and boarding fees will be billed in three equal instalments over the first three terms.

Due dates

Tuition and boarding fees are to be paid in full by the end of the first week of each Term, unless paying by direct debit.

Pre-payment of Fees

A 2% rebate is offered on fees that are paid one year in advance, subject to payment being received by the School on or before first day of Term 1. Tuition and Boarding fees for subsequent years will be accepted at the 2021 rate (with no rebate) if pre-paid by the end of Term 1, 2021.

Additional charges

Additional charges may include excursions, camps, outdoor education, concerts and other activities. Boarders may also incur travel and medical costs.

Payment methods

ELC fees and CGGS Out-of-School Hours Care fees are payable by direct debit only.

Junior and Senior School fees may be paid by:

1. Credit card (MasterCard, Visa and Amex) via online payment portal. Credit card fees apply
2. BPay (details appear on the fee statement)
3. Fortnightly direct debit over 20 fortnights
4. Monthly direct debit over 10 months

Late fees

A late fee may be charged each term if an account is not paid in full by the due date or when payment arrangements lapse.

The late fee is \$55 if the unpaid balance is less than \$1,000, \$110 if the balance is between \$1,001 and \$2,000, and \$220 if the balance is greater than \$2,001.

Refund policy

Tuition and boarding fees are non-refundable and are not subject to pro-rata payments.

Family discount: Preparatory – Year 12

A sibling discount of 7.5% on tuition fees is given for a second child and 15% for a third and any subsequent child simultaneously enrolled at the School. The discount applies to the youngest student.

GST

The School will apply GST to the cost of all taxable supplies. Fees include GST where applicable.

Annual fee review

Fees are subject to annual review by the School Board.

Unpaid fees

If a fee account remains unpaid for more than one term and the School has not agreed to a payment arrangement, the School may remove the right of a child to attend the School or to restrict the participation of the student in any co-curricular activities.

Notice of Withdrawal or Change to Enrolment

In accordance with the Enrolment Agreement, notice of one full school term must be provided in writing to the Admissions Team (admissions@cggs.act.edu.au) to:

- a) cease enrolment; or
- b) change from boarding to day student status.

If this required notice is not provided:

- i. in the case of a), 50% of one school term tuition fees are payable; or
- ii. in the case of b), 50% of the Boarding fees for the term are payable.

Tuition Fees will continue to apply for absences of less than one term. Absence for more than one term is by arrangement with the School.

Textbooks

The Senior School has a complete text book hire service through our Library. If a book is not returned when due, the book is lost or is damaged due to rough treatment, a non-refundable replacement charge will be issued to the students account.

Insurance

The School is not liable for any loss or damage to student property. The School recommends that parents obtain appropriate insurance to cover any losses or damage to student property in particular for mobile technology, musical instruments and sporting equipment.

Resource Levy

In Junior School, resource levies include book pack, diary, school sports carnivals, house funds, excursions and online subscriptions. They do not include camps, co-curricular or voluntary activities.

In Senior School, resource levies includes diary, ID cards, school sport carnivals, house funds, Grammarian donations and online subscriptions. They do not include camps, co-curricular or voluntary activities.

Private health cover

Parents must pay the cost of private health cover for the student for the duration of the enrolment, in advance, in compliance with government visa requirements.

Change of visa status

If a student has a change of visa status, that is becomes a temporary or permanent resident, the full overseas student fee rate will be payable for the duration of that term. Evidence of the new visa status will be required to be presented.
